KEY VOCABULARY

Painting	The process or art of using paint, in a picture, as a protective coating, or as decoration.
Materials	Items which things can be made from.
Mark making	describes the different lines, dots, marks, patterns, and textures we create in an artwork.
Pattern	A pattern is a design in which lines, shapes, forms or colours are repeated.
Texture	How art may be perceived physically, through the sense of touch, or visually, or both.
