### Geographical Skills

#### In this topic, I will:

- Be able to locate Europe on a world map and identify some of its countries and features.
- Be able to locate Asia on a world map and explore the features and characteristics of China.
- Be able to locate Australia on a world map and identify some of its features and characteristics.
- Be able to locate Africa on a world map and explore the features and characteristics of Kenya.
- Be able to identify North America on a world map and explore the characteristics and features of the USA.
- Be able to locate South America on a world map and explore the features and characteristics of Brazil.
- Be able to locate Antarctica on a world map and identify some of its features and characteristics.

#### At the end of this topic, I will:

- Know that the world is split into seven continents
- Locate Europe, Asia, Australia, Africa, North America, South America and Antarctica on a world map/
- Describe some of the geographical features and characteristics of France, China, Australia, Kenya, USA, Brazil, and Antarctica.
- Identify France, China, Australia, Kenya, USA, Brazil and Antarctica on a world map
- Know that Australia is a country and a continent

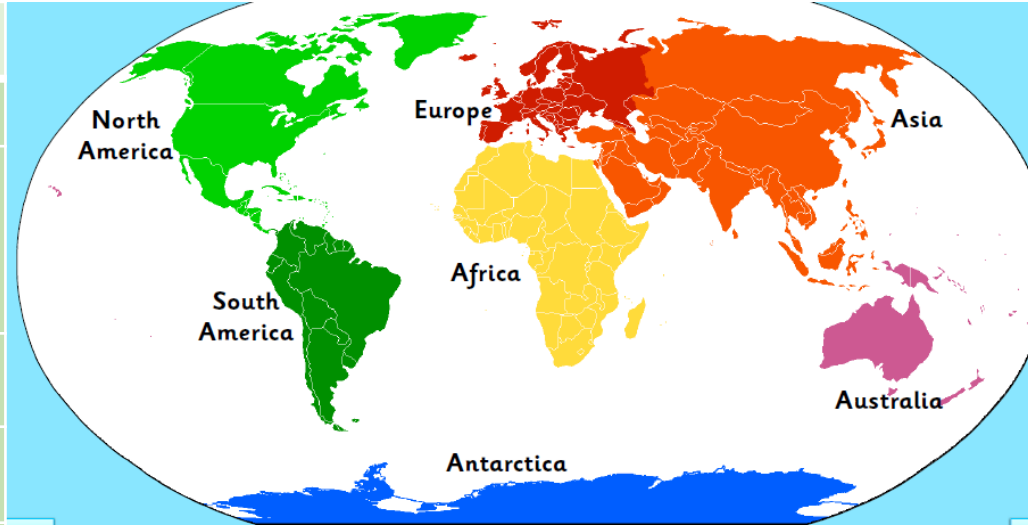
#### National Curriculum Link:

- use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather.
- use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key human features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop
- use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied at this key stage

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## KEY VOCABULARY

Europe	The fifth largest continent
Continent	any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica)
The United Kingdom	The country we live in
Flag	It is used to represent a country
City	An area which has lots of buildings where lots of people live
Country	An area of land with its own government
Human Features	What humans have done to the land
Physical Features	The natural features of the land.
