<p>Additional sporting equipment was acquired in the year for the children to use during break and lunchtimes.</p> <p>Extra-curricular clubs were provided free of charge for children throughout school to attend.</p> <p>4 children in Year 5 were trained as Young Sports Leaders and joined the team of 4 young leaders in Year 6. These children led PE sessions and after-school clubs along with qualified coaches.</p> <p>Achieved the Bronze Standard School Games Award.</p> <p>As part of learning to keep our bodies healthy, children in Years 5&6 were trained in first aid – this was also offered as extra-curricular for other children throughout school</p> <p>Children throughout school attended an increasing number of inter-school activities and competitions. A number of these events were specifically aimed at children with SEND.</p> <p>A skills based curriculum continued to be embedded throughout the school delivered by specialist teachers who not only deliver the sessions but upskill our own members of staff to deliver PE sessions.</p>	<p>Further spending is needed to replace and replenish equipment.</p> <p>To maintain the current offer and look towards offering a wider variety of extra-curricular clubs need to be offered in school.</p> <p>This will be continued in the next academic year.</p> <p>Work towards the Silver Standard School Games Award with aspirations of working towards the Gold award.</p> <p>This proved extremely popular in school and we will try and replicate this in the next academic year.</p> <p>Expand the offer of inter sports competitions and looking to increase the number offered to our younger pupils.</p> <p>Staff to continue to work with specialist teachers to develop their own pedagogy to teach PE.</p>
